DESCRIPTION OF FEE STRUCTURE, IF APPLICABLE:

95% of the funds raised go to the purchase of food for children. 5% is used for administrative costs. Our Chapter of End 68 Hours of Hunger is a non-profit (501C(3) organization that provides food for preschool through grade 6 children over the weekends; 3 dinners, 2 lunches, 2 breakfasts and snacks. It is run 100% by volunteers and relies on financial donations and fundraising to purchase the food needed over the course of the year. The cost is \$16.00/child/weekend with an annual expenditure of food is \$90,214.85. Our Chapter serves an average of 145 children up from 130 in 2023 from the towns of Wolfeboro, Tuftonboro, Ossipee, Effingham, and Middleton. School counselors, health providers, teachers and administrators recommend students who are in need of food over the weekends. Thirty-four volunteers donated their time culminating in 1602 hours and 3480 miles this past year: filling a total of 5,398 bags throughout the school and summer months. As a result of our limited ability to reach all children in need over the past summer months, during this past summer, 2024, we extended our food pickup locations to town churches, libraries and individual businesses. Such a move improved our ability to serve 30 students per week during the summer months to 55 students per week.

DEFINE UNIT OF SERVICE FOR THIS PROGRAM:

Weekend food for a child at risk of food insecurity has been provided weekly for 38 weeks of the school year and 5 weeks over the summer months. This year we were able to expand our program to be year round and our food pick up locations to include town libraries, schools, churches and individual businesses. This proved to reach more families as we increased our numbers receiving bags from 35 children per week to 60 students.

Focus of Program: Providing weekend food for preschool-grade 6 children at risk of food insecurity. End 68 Hours of Hunger Wolfeboro Area is a private, non-profit (501-C-3) organization that works to confront the approximately 68 hours of hunger that some children experience between the free lunch they receive at school on Friday and the free breakfast they receive at school on Monday morning. Our program is run solely by volunteers and funding relies on fundraising and financial donations of which 95% is earmarked solely to purchase food. Food is purchased utilizing funds raised by donations, grants and fundraising and packed into bags for a weekly distribution to preschool through grade 6 children.

Services: The unity and support from the communities within the GWRSD has been substantial: enabling us to maintain a supply of food for a month or two at a time, increasing services from a school calendar program to year-round. In addition to the overwhelming support from our communities, the GWRSD Administration, Home/School Coordinator, school counselors at each school and the GWRSD district's transportation department have played a significant role in the success of our program.

Our organization is run solely by unpaid volunteers who work together to fill and distribute the weekly food bags at each school, complete the daily and monthly financial requirements, plan and organize fundraising events, provide publicity in various venues, and order, purchase, and stock the food supply. All Saints Episcopal Church, in keeping with its outreach mission, provides a location for our Chapter of End 68 Hours of Hunger.

Population: Preschool through grade 6 children living within the Governor Wentworth Regional School District (Ossipee, Tuftonboro, Wolfeboro, Effingham, and Brookfield as well as Middleton) receive the weekend food bags.

Our Mission: Studies have shown that children who suffer from hunger have difficulty concentrating on schoolwork and being alert. Our goal is to assure children are ready to learn by providing food for Pre K-Grade 6 children in the communities of Wolfeboro, Brookfield, Tuftonboro, Ossipee, Effingham, and Middleton as well as Ossipee Head Start.
